Wet Weather Policy

Olds Park

In the first instance Hurstville Council will decide if Olds Park is fit for play and their decisions are conveyed via their wet weather line 9330 6272.

In the event that Hurstville Council have not closed the park but weather conditions have deteriorated, the club secretary will inspect the ground at 7am on match days.

The secretary will notify RTO's of the decision via phone, text or email.

Other Grounds

The same system operates at all grounds in the St.George area. The Association will notify the club secretary by 7.30am of any other grounds that have been deemed unfit for play. The club secretary will notify RTO's via phone, text or email.

RTO's should notify their players and officials as soon as practical when matches have been postponed.

Training

Hurstville Council will advise if Olds Park is open for training via their wet weather line 9330 6272. If the ground is closed, no form of training should take place.
